Important changes to the organisational audit methodology

This element of the audit programme has a new and improved data set based on the IBD national service standards (updated 2013) and is being delivered using the successfully established IBDQIP methodology. Using a web-based assessment tool, multidisciplinary teams sit together to discuss and enter data about the service they deliver. After data completion, you will get an instant result on a dashboard which enables you to benchmark the quality of the service you deliver against national averages.

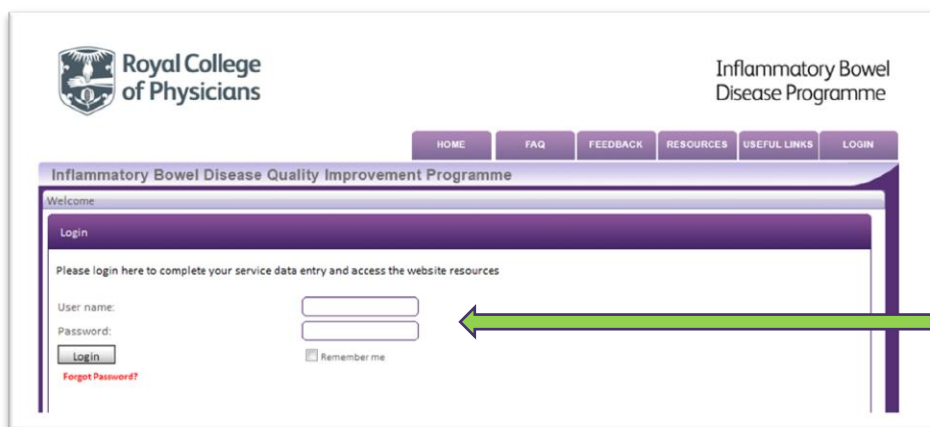

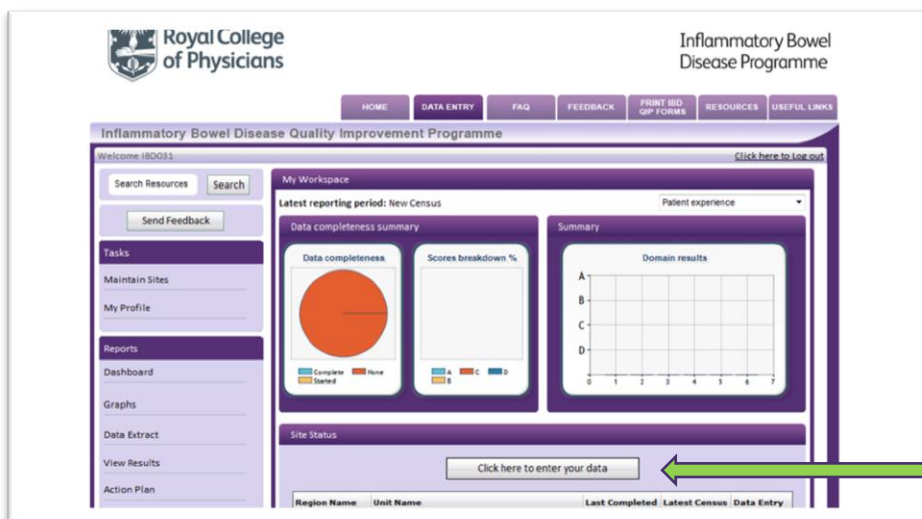
